KURDI is a collaboration between Peri Ibrahim and acclaimed documentary maker Doug Aubrey (*Victim of Geography, Louder than Bombs, A Different Pitch* and *See You in the Next War*) and the product of an intensive six years of work.

Sparked by his experience covering the murder of Firsat Dag in Glasgow's Sighthill in 2001 for Channel 4 News, Aubrey set out to tell the tale of those seeking asylum in Scotland. He met exiled Kurd Peri Ibrahim, and would go with him back to a newly liberated Kurdistan in 2004.

Doug Aubrey says: "In an attempt to simply fit in and assimilate in the western world – and in the UK particularly after 7/7 - a lot of asylum seekers and refugees won't talk. *KURDI* is a film about one of these people in search of a past, a present and, even though we didn't know it at the time, a future..."
